

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Here is a Top Ten Most frequently asked questions about hybrid learning for your Kellogg Middle School students! If you cannot see the answer to your question, go to the Kellogg Middle School hybrid learning handbook <u>here</u>.

### **Q**. I missed the Family Information Night a couple of weeks ago. Where can I see the recording?

### Q. What is required for my child to attend school on campus during hybrid learning?

A. Here are the things that your child needs to remember:

#### 1. Where PPE at all times:

PPE stands for **personal protective equipment**. Your child is required to wear a face mask at all times. If your child rides the bus, they will also be required to wear a face mask. Ensure your child has an extra mask in their backpack in case the one they are using gets damaged or wet. ### 2. Provide Attestation BEFORE school:

Before your child arrives to school a daily attestation needs to be provided in one of the following ways before your child gets on the bus, is dropped off by car or bikes/walks to school:

- Parents can download and install the Parent Square app and login to submit daily screening/attestation. Learn how to <u>here</u>.
- Your child can do this on their own if they download and install the **Student Square** application on their phone.
- Print and bring a signed Daily Attestation form. You can download and print at:

### 3. Physical Distancing

All students need to adhere to the 6 feet apart social distancing rule. There are markers in the school hallways indicating which way to walk and how to keep distance between each other while moving from class to class. If your child has questions about this, have them ask their onsite staff. All teachers and staff have trained on the physical distancing rules required for hybrid learning.

### 4. Bring Chromebook & Charger:

Each student should bring their Chromebook and charger daily to school. Please remind your child to charge their laptop completely before attending school the next day. Children cannot bring their personal computers from home. If your child does not have a Chromebook, please contact the school office first thing on Monday morning.

### 5. <u>No Food:</u>

Students are not allowed to eat food on campus unless they have it prearranged with the nurse for a specific medical reason. But please encourage your child to **bring a labeled water bottle** as there are plenty of water stations around the school! And make sure your child eats a healthy breakfast/lunch before they come to school as they will not be allowed to eat snacks during their time at school unless previously organized with the school nurse.

### 6. Phone rule:

Your child may bring their phone to school but be silenced during the day. Please encourage your child to keep their phone in their backpack. If you need to reach your child during school hours, please call the front office at **206.393.4783** 

### Q. What if I don't know my child's bus schedule?

### Q. Can I get a review of the learning schedule?

There will be two cohorts: Cohort A(morning) and Cohort B(afternoon). If you do not know your child's cohort, please contact the school before school starts on Monday morning. If you are not able to do this, visit Family Access on Skyward at: <u>https://tinyurl.com/uvwfkmef</u>

- Log into Skyward.
- Select your child's name from the ALL STUDENTS drop down at the top left of the page.
- Click on the Schedule item on the left side. You will see what your child's schedule is on the right hand side.
- If your child has their classes listed in the morning, follow the Cohort A/morning schedule. If their classes are listed in the afternoon, follow the Cohort B/afternoon schedule.

# **Q.** Where can I see the learning schedule?

### Q. What if my child has ZERO period P.E.?

If your child has Zero period P.E:

Cohort A: Arrive at 7:05 am, class starts at 7:10 am Cohort B: Arrive at 11:30 am, class starts at 11:35 am

Zero period students can come right into the commons area and go straight to the Gym. Bus transportation will not be provided for Zero period P.E. students.

### Q. What about Wednesdays?

All students will have **asynchronous learning** on Wednesdays. Below is a review of when this time period occurs and what might be required of your child:

Time	Wednesday All Secondary Students Learning Schedule

12:50	Asynchronous Remote Learning Asynchronous Activities: Homework, projects, therapeutic services, small group projects, access teachers via email or Canvas. Possible synchronous activities: music ensembles, therapeutic services, synchronous class activities at discretion of teacher

### Q. What is the drop off and pick up process for students?

#### **IMPORTANT:**

- All students should stay off campus until 7:55 (Cohort A) or 12:20 (Cohort B).
- Students cannot enter school early and mingling is not encouraged due to COVID restrictions.
- Mask up! Make sure your child has a mask and is wearing it properly prior to arriving on campus/riding the bus.
- All students will enter Kellogg through the Commons door.
- Excluding Zero period PE students, all students must go to their Roundtable classroom as soon as they enter the school.



### For students being dropped off via car:

Note the entrance and exit in the image above. Drive to the turn around loop and let your child off at the drop-off area and immediately exit the premises. Your child should proceed to the Commons door to enter the school and immediately go to their Roundtable classroom.

### For students walking or riding bikes:

Students must stay on sidewalks if they are walking or riding their bike to school. Parents who accompany their child may not go beyond the drop off point as indicated by signs on campus and in the figure above. Students riding bikes may enter in the designated area in the image above and lock their bike up with their own locks. There will be no locks provided by the school.

### Zero period PE students:

Zero period PE students may come in 5 minutes prior to your class start time to prepare for class.

#### For pick up:

Dismissal will occur between 1050 and 1055 for Cohort A/morning, and 3:15-3:20 for Cohort B/afternoon. There will be 4 exit locations for students:

- Main Doors

- Commons Doors
- Gym doors,
- Music doors.

Parents are asked to make a designated pickup spot with your student to make things easier on them, and on you! If your child is in an afterschool activity, have them proceed to the activity location immediately after school.

### Q. Will my child have access to change clothes after PE?

Unfortunately, no. Due to strict covid protocols, students will not be allowed to change clothes in the locker room after PE. It is recommended students wear comfortable clothing that works for both their PE class and to wear during the day at their other classes.

# Q. What if my child is/becomes sick?

If your child becomes sick while at school or after being at school please keep them home and follow this information provided by the district:
